Castlemill Boatyard: PUBLIC MEETING IN OXFORD TOWN HALL 5:30PM TUESDAY 11TH DECEMBER Councillors will vote on the planning application

If you are concerned about the future of the Castlemill boatyard in Jericho, we urge you to attend a special public meeting where Councillors will vote on whether to accept the planning application on the site.

The application for 54 flats, which was submitted in June by the developers Spring Residential, has attracted a huge number of objections. Protests from local residents and members of the local boating community have highlighted

numerous concerns ranging from the scale and height of the development, to the scarcity of affordable housing, to the lack of replacement boatyard facilities—a main reason the previous application on the site was rejected. If you have any views on the future of Castlemill boatyard and the development of Jericho then please come to the meeting on the 11th.

Even if you don't want to speak, attending the meeting will make a statement in itself—it shows you care about what happens at Castlemill.
